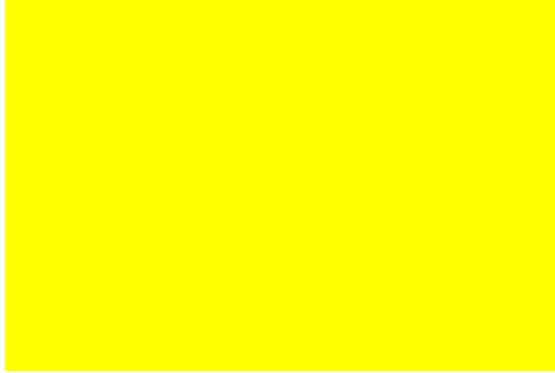
# Data
