Data Driven Graduate Student Mentorship

- Why address mentorship?
 - There is practically no data about the "research" health of the graduate student body.
 - Very little mentorship beyond that provided by the research advisors.
 - Students without research advisors receive inconsistent advising from the faculty.

Data Driven Graduate Student Mentorship

• How does the lack of mentorship impact the department?

- Student retention rates
 - First year students struggle to find appropriate research advisors.
 - They fail quals etc., especially domestic students.
 - This impacts degree completion rates and increases time-to-degree.
- Students who cannot identify a research advisor rely on TAships, thereby straining the system.
- Students rely exclusively on their faculty advisors for job placement assistance(faculty positions, industry).
 - Missed opportunities for providing customized assistance at the departmental level to some of our star students.
- TA assignments become problematic since we cannot differentiate between deserving and non-deserving students.

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Data Driven Graduate Student Mentorship

- We have started a student data collection drive for first and second year students.
 - Please describe your experience in our graduate program this semester.
 - Please describe your efforts in identifying a research advisor.
 - Which faculty members have you contacted? Please list specific faculty members.
 - If you have identified a research advisor, please state the name of the research advisor and area of research to be pursued.
 - What have you done to prepare for the written qualifying exam? How do you plan to prepare?
- More elaborate data collection followed by implementation of a mentorship program shall follow. At this point the graduate office will reach out to some students who may need assistance.
- Data is for exclusive use of the graduate office and shall not be released to the faculty in raw form.
